categories (boys and girls). More than 25 students participated and secured 2nd, 3rd and 4th place.

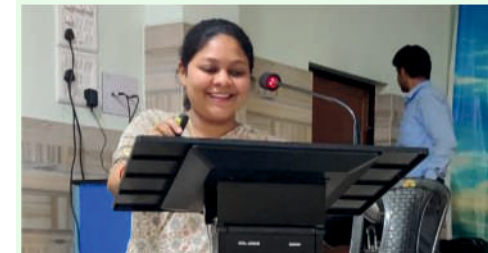


IN-HOUSE TRAINING

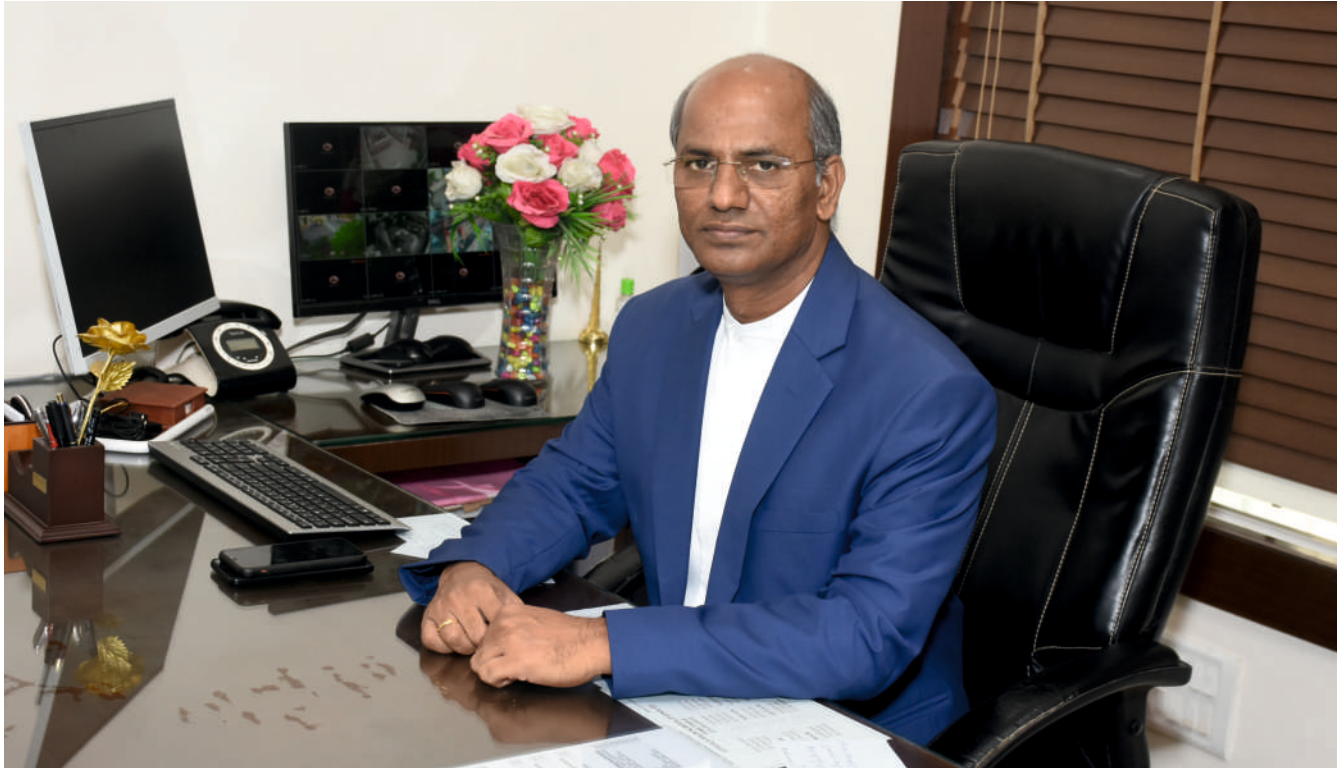

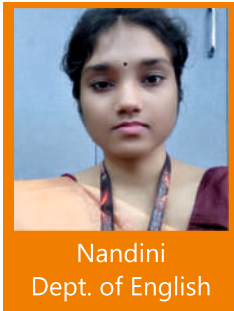

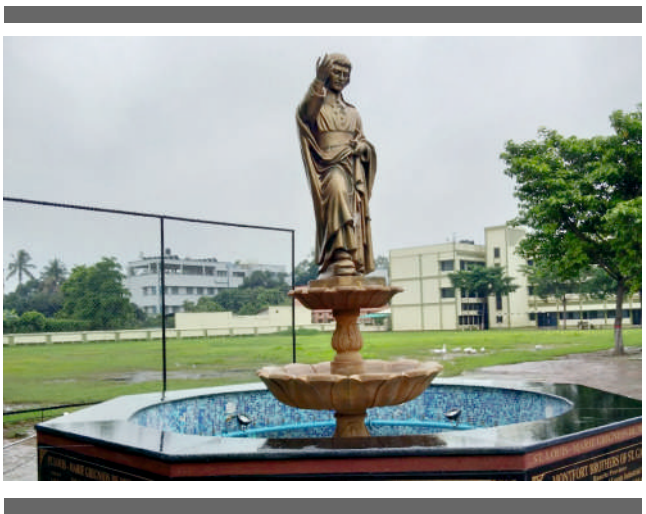

I AM MOTHER EARTH

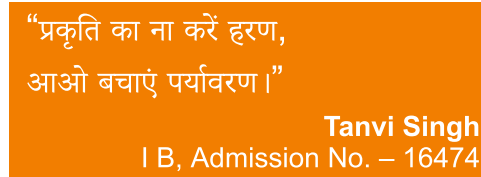
I am unique among all the planets
